After playing the games, the participants were divided into two groups. Organizers sheets of paper were printed children's rights in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. Each participant started after the sheet and read aloud to children's rights, each discussing. A. The organizers told about the camp for children from around the world, where there were about 300 children. Participants were invited to participate in the next year, the human rights journey to Switzerland, Germany and France.

Head of the Department's Galinienė presented library the literature on children's rights, thanked Dr. Arielle Rosita King and host of the event - Lithuanian children's human rights ambassadors - Aurelija, to deposit and Lucrezia, and gave them gifts of remembrance. The participants - children gifts received after book on Europe, the organizers will offer them sweets.

Each child who participated in the event of human rights, the participant will receive a certificate. For most children, meeting with the human rights working people was an opportunity to learn more about human rights. This is the first step for children who want to help the International Fund for next summer to participate in human rights on the road visiting other countries.

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
